### HUARAZ: HUASCARÁN GLACIER (6.768mt/22.205ft)

#### 1<sup>st</sup> day | Huaraz / Musho / Huascarán Camp Base **L D**

Transfer to Musho village (3.100mt/10.170ft). From here, hike until Huascarán Camp base (4.700mt/15.420ft). Dinner and overnight.

#### 2<sup>nd</sup> day | Huascarán Camp Base / Camp I **B L D**

After breakfast, ascend the Huascarán's South peak, the highest snow-capped peak of the tropics, by its normal route. The approach starts from the slopes of the western glacier edge of Rajupampa. Rajupampa is the ice tongue of the western glacier, which originates in "La Garganta" (snow saddle between the North and South summits), place to set up the camp (5.400mt/17.715ft). Dinner and overnight.

#### 3<sup>rd</sup> day | Camp I / Camp II **B L D**

Ascend the western glacier diagonally toward the south side of La Garganta (6.000mt/19.685ft) to roomy ice terraces. Here, the camp will be installed. Dinner and overnight.

#### 4<sup>th</sup> day | Camp II / Summit / Camp II **B L D**

Climb the northwest slopes to the South peak of Huascarán, then to the summit. The spectacular view of the tropic's highest peaks and the Cordillera Blanca scenery is an exhilarating experience. Afterwards, descend for overnight at La Garganta.

#### 5<sup>th</sup> day | Camp II / Camp Base **B L D**

Descend to Base Camp. Afternoon is at leisure.

#### 6<sup>th</sup> day | Base Camp / Musho / Huaraz **B L**

After breakfast, descend to Musho for the land transfer to Huaraz, lunch included.



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### HUARAZ: ALPAMAYO GLACIER (5.947mt/19.510ft)

#### 1<sup>st</sup> day | Huaraz / Paria **L D**

Transfer to Vaqueria, passing along the Callejón de Huaylas, Llanganuco and Portachuelo. At Vaquería, hike along the Huaripampa Gorge, crossing Ranincuray Gorge, swampy meadows, small lakes and forests. Arrival at Paria to install the camp.

#### 2<sup>nd</sup> day | Trekking Paria / Punta Unión / Arhuaycocha **B L D**

Climb Incan stone-carved steps to arrive to Punta Unión Pass (4.750mt/15.585ft) to descend to Arhuaycocha Lake enjoying the magnificent view of Alpacayo Peak, and set up the base camp (4.450mt/14.600ft).

#### 3<sup>rd</sup> day | Arhuaycocha / Moraine Camp **B L D**

Climb up Alpacayo moraine until arriving at Moraine Camp I (5.000mt/16.405ft).

#### 4<sup>th</sup> day | Moraine Camp / Camp I **B L D**

Climb up Alpacayo glacier and set up our Camp I (5.400mt/17.720ft)

#### 5<sup>th</sup> day | Camp I / Summit / Camp I **B L D**

Climb up to the summit of Alpacayo Peak from where we enjoy spectacular views of the Cordillera Blanca's highest peaks. Return to the Camp for overnight.

#### 6<sup>th</sup> day | Camp I / Base Camp / Arhuaycocha **B L D**

Descend to Arhuaycocha Lake (Base Camp).

#### 7<sup>th</sup> day | Arhuaycocha / Llamacorral **B L D**

Enjoying the spectacular panorama, descend to the lower valley of Jatun Quishuar, and then continue to Llama Corral (3.780mt/12.400ft) to set up the camp.

#### 8<sup>th</sup> day | Llamacorral / Cashapampa / Huaraz **B L**

Hike down the narrow Santa Cruz Canyon until Cashapampa village to learn about community participation in ecotourism projects. From here, transfer to Huaraz.

#### THE PROGRAMS IN HUARAZ INCLUDE

Transfers / English-speaking Mountain guide, porters, cook / Mules / Bipersonal tents, dining tent, tableware / Insulation blankets / Full board / First aid kit / Huascarán National Park entrance

#### THE PROGRAM DOES NOT INCLUDE

Overnights at Huaraz / Sleeping bag
